Camden Methodist is fortunate to have such a capable artist in attendance. Our SPOTLIGHT feature this month is on Julie Foster, who not only helps create the props and backdrop for the yearly Vacation Bible School, but has also painted the mural depicting God's Creation and His Plan for salvation on the way leading to the Fellowship Hall.

Ask her about It! The scripture text on the top and middle are God's good intent for humanity and the scriptures that are below instruct humanity to be careful in the things we do. It is intended to remind us of God's



mastery and our human need for God's intervention ...Jesus. A tree shaped as the letter "T" is at the beginning... stating that, The Word of the Lord is Good. The same

tree provides the shape of the cross at the end of the mural. Walk along it and note the scripture verses and where they are placed, also count the days of creation.

Julie was born in and Oklahoma City, Oklahoma to Betty and Robert Jones. Her brother Duane was nine at the time and was like a parent to her, often taking on that role while her parents were busy. Duane was gifted with an artistic hand and would spend time drawing with his little sister. Robert was a hardworking leatherneck and worked in the oil fields and her mother, with a knack for prose, wrote for the local newspaper. When she was two years old, the family moved to Ogden, Utah where both parents were employed as civil servants at Hill Air Force Base.

Julie spent her summers with extended family in Texas and Oklahoma. Her Grandmother Jones and Aunt Myra took her to Sunday school and church. It is in Sunday school that Julie first started learning about Jesus, unconditional love, and forgiveness. This is one of the reasons that she thinks it is so important to teach art at the Methodist Home for Children, using art as a vehicle to break down barriers and show the love of Christ. Children need to learn of Jesus in a loving and kind way to prepare them for life's trails. She remembers acknowledging God as a part of her life even as a young girl and feeling His presence in a beautiful sunset and hearing His voice speaking words of comfort. After one summer when she was around eight years old, she asked her mom to take her to church. Her mother dutifully dropped her off on Sunday mornings. It was at the First Baptist Church in Ogden, Utah that she received an altar call and was baptized the next Sunday.

Her enthusiasm for art and gardening sprang from her grandparents in Oklahoma and there was a great deal of musical talent on both sides of her family. Julie does not remember a time when she didn't sing almost everything all the time, either out loud or in her head. She will often be found singing while she is drawing or painting. Her brother told her that she whistled in her crib when she was a toddler, but she doesn't remember that!

Julie lived in Utah until 5th grade and moved with her mother to Minot, North Dakota after her

parent's second remarriage and divorce from each other. Fond of her teenage years in North Dakota, Julie remembers her dog, Buck, (yes, the name is inspired by Jack London's, *Call of the Wild*) and their awesome days playing in the snow. She went to an excellent school in Minot and was encouraged by her art teachers. Unbeknownst to her at the time, her art teacher, Mrs. Brekke, entered one of her acrylic paintings in a statewide competition. Her painting, *Sailing*, won the Congressional Governor's Art Show for North Dakota and was displayed with other national winners in Washington, D. C.'s Congressional Hall. Thank you, art teachers everywhere!

Earning a scholarship to The University of North Dakota in 1990, she graduated with a B.A. in French and Art History, with a study abroad year in Rennes, France.

Her brother at that time had joined the Coast Guard and was living in Mobile, Alabama. She went to stay with him after graduation. It was here that her brother introduced her to John Foster, a fellow Coastie. After a wonderful six month courtship, she married the love of her life and proceeded to follow him to various duty stations: Traverse City where her sons, Jack and Walter were born, Elizabeth City, where Doreen Nash and Theresa Molthen introduced them to Camden (United) Methodist, Air Station Detroit where they lived in Marysville, a great place to raise children, Houston, Texas where they lived for a year and finally back to Camden again. Whew!



Her favorite food is anything Asian, as long as it is gluten free! Her hope for the future of the church is that there would be a continued outpouring of His love to the unchurched community. One of Julie's favorite hymns, *In the Garden*, was also her grandmother's and her favorite scripture is Ephesians 2:10, *"For we are God's masterpiece, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, that God has prepared for us in advance to do." Amen!*
