There is a saying that people come into our lives for a reason, for a season, or for a lifetime. It is our desire that the person featured today will be with our church for the rest of his life. Our Spotlight today is about George Stonikinis, who started coming to Camden Methodist Church several months ago. Our lives have been enriched by having George and his wife, Suzanne, in our midst.

With Pastor Wayne and George at Bible Study, we are doubly blessed. Pastor Wayne does a great job explaining the scripture while George makes each of us believe the words, written centuries ago, are speaking directly to us, individually, today. In the absence of Pastor Wayne, George has led our Bible Study as well as delivered the message on Sunday morning. Here is George's story.

At last I have been brought "Home"! Born the only child in a large extended family in Tidewater, Virginia, my early years were shaped by Methodist values in a loving and supportive family (my parents always had time for me!). My entire life has been blessed and the grace of Christ has never failed to provide experiences that got my attention and revealed His plan for my life...when I listened! My early childhood is recalled with fond memories of family, church activities, and opportunities for growth and learning that my parents could provide. When I was ten we relocated to Arlington, Virginia and school became my preoccupation...I loved it! Science fairs, sports, internships, studying, and there were "books!" And my family and parents were right there supporting me!

At the same time my life was bring formed in Northern Virginia, a most important part of my destiny back in Tidewater was also being prepared...a future gift of God.

I attended Virginia Tech, earning B.S. and M.S. degrees in sociology and fell in love with "learning," my real hobby. Soon, I was a professor at Longwood University where teaching, writing and presenting papers at both the national and international level, administrative assignments, and becoming a departmental chairman focused my career. The Methodist Church was across the street from my office, and I taught adult Sunday school. During this time I fell in love with Suzanne, that gift of God from Tidewater, and we mutually supported each other in our careers and formed a strong and nurturing faith-based family: a son, now an educator in Waco, Texas, with two teenage daughters; and a daughter, a specialist in mortgage and title processes in Central Florida with an adult daughter.

Over 25 years ago, after three years of seminary training, I became an ordained Catholic Deacon and was given my own church in Amelia, Virginia. As a full-time professor and running a church (weddings, funerals masses, etc.) life was busy, but fulfilling. After 35 years as a professor we moved to Weeksville as Suzanne had been offered a position as Director of Surgical Services, it was her turn! I retired and became a deacon at the two local Catholic churches...for almost 20 years I served weekly and daily masses, taught classes, conducted funerals and weddings, and each day I increasingly realized the Cathodic Church was less and less the Catholic "faith!" It had changed and left me! My Protestant roots called me back, and the incredible men at Camden Methodist Men's Group spoke faithfilled volumes to me! These powerful, dedicated, genuine Christians passionately shared their faith...and...at last...I found myself at home.

Once again in my life, I have been gifted by God direct "grace!" Camden Methodist Church, and its Holy Spirit animated parishioners, build and sustain my faith through their wisdom, example, and passion for the Word of God! The future of Camden Methodist Church is in their hands, and their steadfast faith and Spirit driven wisdom will serve His kingdom. I have preached in St. Paul's Basilica at the Vatican, pilgrimage churches in Rome, St. Mark's Basilica in Venice, the Upper Room in Jerusalem, on the shore of the Sea of Galilee...but YOU, my dear Christian sisters and brothers, humble me...you're Christ in the World!

Lunch will be catered by Topside and will include fried chicken, BBQ, cole slaw, collards, baked beans, corn bread and more.



Ash Wednesday is one of the most important dates on the Christian calendar because it marks the start of Lent. Lent is observed each year to prepare for the celebration of Easter, when Christ rose from the dead to sit at the right hand of God, His father.

Ash Wednesday is celebrated this year on Wednesday, February 14. It always falls 6 1/2 weeks before Easter. It is celebrated over 46 days. It includes 40 days of fasting, self-sacrifice, and prayer and six Sundays on which fasting is not practiced.

The 40-day period has a special significance in both testaments of the Bible. In the Old Testament we are told Moses spent 40 days and nights with God on Mount Sinai in preparation to receive the Ten Commandments. In the New Testament we learn that after Jesus was baptized, He was led by the Spirit into the wilderness where he spent 40 days and 40 nights fasting. It was there, after 40 days and nights of fasting, that the devil tempted him.
